What is a DD Council?

Congress created State/Territorial Councils on Developmental Disabilities (**DD Councils**) so people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) and their families could **identify problems or gaps** in state and federal support systems and **create innovative solutions** with community partners to **improve outcomes for people with I/DD**

- Appropriated under the Labor-HHS-Education Bill
- Authorized under the Developmental Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act (DD Act)
- Funded within the Administration for Community Living (ACL), under the Department of Health and Human Services

Description

Council members' efforts to expand access to height-adjustable, adult size changing tables assisted in the installation of 50 tables across the state. In addition to the state committing to install tables at state facilities, there is now grant funding for municipalities and businesses to place tables in non-state facilities. Members of the TN DD Council also helped create a national map of table locations.

Description
